The OSM Fund of Benevolence was founded at the close of the 19th Century, and in December 1899 it was formally opened with a credit balance of seventeen guineas. The Fund annually distributes tens of thousands of pounds to Secret Monitor Petitioners and local charities through its Match Funding Program.



During the 2024-25 Match Funding Program, the OSM Fund of Benevolence awarded **£9,300** to Provinces throughout England, Wales, Scotland and the Channel Islands. The charities that benefit from the generosity of the Brethren around the world are wide and varied, however all have one thing in common – they were all raising funds for capital items to help those in need.

Dementia Jersey was formed 15 years ago is a team of dedicated professionals who give expert support on all types of dementia, they raise awareness and campaign to improve services for people with dementia and those who care for them. With an estimated 1,600 people with Dementia in Jersey the charity has formed a 5-year strategy with the Government. The £1,000 donation will go towards new electronic tap to donate machines which will assist in raising even more funds to expand their support.

Save the Family offers temporary housing and round-the-clock support to homeless and at-risk families. Their rural site provides tailored assistance from a trauma-informed team, empowering families to overcome challenges and build a brighter future.

Match Funding goes towards the purchase of two new cookers, a fridge and a large hob in the community kitchen at Cotton Hall.

The charity has greatly assisted one of our members who has MS, through the use of hyperbaric oxygen therapy. They currently receive no government funding and are looking at two projects.

Funds will go towards the upgrade of the roof including fascias and downpipes and get a new water heater.
